FARM TO SCHOOL



We're proud to share that in 2024, Land to Hand taught 187 second-grade students through six months of immersive nutrition and cooking classes.

The curriculum was truly hands-on, with students making everything from rainbow smoothies with local beets to savory salads featuring Montana-grown carrots, lentils, and chickpeas.

Farm to School education is vital for the next generation to truly understand and appreciate where their food comes from.

Classes in the Wildcat Garden

Our educational reach is growing! From 2023 to 2024, we saw a 25% increase in the number of Columbia Falls School District classes visiting the Wildcat Garden to engage with plants and food systems.



School Coins

Local students can pick up a \$5 coin at the L2H booth for free and can spend it on fresh fruits, vegetables, or plants that grow food. 232 students from 15 different Flathead Valley schools engaged in School Coin spending at local markets in 2024.



Harvest of the Month

In 2024, our Harvest of the Month programming soared, putting hands-on cooking into the classroom. Fourteen different classes successfully prepared seven seasonal recipes throughout the year, resulting in samples reaching over 1,600 students throughout the school district.





FOOD FOR ALL



We've seen another year of significant growth in the utilization of our Food for All programs, particularly at the Kalispell market. The community's need is clear, and we're proud to be addressing it.

Across both markets in 2024, we provided \$10,689 in Double SNAP Dollar incentives, which our participants then turned into \$33,500+ in SNAP-eligible sales. This spending directly supports our local producers, proving that our clients are actively choosing to back the local food system. Thank you for making such a positive impact!



FOOD RX

Food Rx is designed to address the interconnected issues of food insecurity and diet-related health risks. We supply participating families with a regular share of fresh produce, completely free of charge, ensuring that healthy eating is accessible to those who need it most.

In 2024, every member of the Food Rx program received tools to maximize their health journey. In addition to regular fresh produce shares, they had access to seasonal nutrition education, user-friendly recipes corresponding to their produce shares, and hands-on learning through in-person classes offered at Logan Health.

In 2024, we saw an increase of 13% in the total amount spent on fresh produce through the Food Rx Program, which directly supports our local farmers and economy.

WEEKEND BACKPACK PROGRAM



Our Columbia Falls based meal program ensures students don't go hungry when school is out. We provide essential supplemental meals during weekends and school holidays. Elementary and middle school students receive pre-packed food bags, all assembled by our incredible volunteers.

Columbia Falls High School students benefit from a choice-style food pantry right on campus, allowing them to select foods that fit their specific needs.



80,700 Total meals distributed in 2024

1,623 Holiday bags handed out

375 Students receiving weekend food each week

Thursday Pickup | 3pm - 6pm

For families not enrolled in the school-based distribution, we offer an open food pickup every Thursday at our Columbia Falls location. This option ensures any family in the community can access essential weekend food support.



Through our fresh snack program, over 27,000 pounds of local produce were distributed to CFSD schools in 2024. Through this program, we spent over \$7,800 on locally sourced apples and carrots.

Community Produce Fridge

After a successful launch of our community produce fridge, we now have one fridge at the Wildcat Garden and one at our office in Whitefish.

The fridges are often stocked with fresh produce harvested from the Wildcat Garden or donated by Whitefish Lions Club members and other local farmers. We also had many community members who donated produce grown in their backyard gardens. The fridges make it easy for Backpack Program participants to take fresh food home for the weekend.

If you have extra abundance from your own garden, we accept donations of fresh produce! Find the fridge at 279 Veteran Dr, Columbia Falls on the porch, or at 311 E 1st St B, Whitefish, MT 59937 in the alley.

FREE THE SEEDS







Free The Seeds is our largest annual educational gathering, offering interactive workshops, activities, and free seed sharing for everyone in the community. Our 2024 event, themed "Honoring Our Roots: Sowing the Seeds of a Sustainable Future," was our most attended yet! Additionally, we ensure year-round access to seeds through our Seed Library at the Columbia Falls Imaginelf library.

Please remember to plant, grow, and then SAVE some seeds to donate back to us so we can get them cleaned, packaged, and back out into the community. Find seeds at our year-round Seed Library in the Columbia Falls Library.

If you've ever planted fava beans or buckwheat seeds from the seed library in Columbia Falls, it's almost guaranteed that they were grown by Christine Dye in her backyard garden in Kalispell. Chris was one of the founding members of Free the Seeds and championed every part of the seed giveaway. Every year, Chris grew and donated seeds, weighed, measured, and sorted seeds to be packed for the event, staffed the seed room, and connected Land to Hand with local classrooms to have kids help with packing seeds. We are so grateful to Chris for 10 years of supporting Free the Seeds and miss her dearly.



We are immensely grateful for the vast network of volunteers who make our work possible. This includes countless dedicated solo and family volunteers, student groups, and a wide array of community organizations. 
